Dear Congresswoman/Senator...

As a constituent of yours in California, I am contacting you regarding my son Jimmy Ryan, who after suffering an attempt upon his life through suffocation with a plastic bag by National Defense Medical College hospital military medical doctors, and nurse, suffered pediatric acquired brain injury (PABI). Our son subsequently was left in a vegetative state, and dependent upon life support.

Not only have we reported the attempted murder to the police, but since military hospital personnel are involved the police have refused to take action. We have also, repeatedly, requested Consular assistance under art. 5 and 38 of the Convention of Consular Relations, as well as US Department of State guidelines (7 FAM 1930).

In the past years, I have repeatedly solicited assistance from my American Consulate in Tokyo under the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR22, art. 71.1, 71.6, §10.735–215, §101.3(b)), US Code (22USC, art. 2715a & 3904(1)), US Department of State Foreign Affairs Manual (7FAM, 1930's), and Convention of Consular Relations (art. 2, 5 & 38). However, to date the American Consulate and Embassy in Tokyo have repeatedly refused to provide me with the assistance I have requested, and as required by law.

I hope that you might contact the US Department of State, Bureau of Consular Affairs requesting that they assure that the American Embassy in Tokyo comply with US Department of State guidelines and international laws, and applicable conventions, in assuring that Japanese government launch a full investigation into the criminal acts committed by hospital personnel.

My son's life may still be saved with regenerative tissue medicine, and expert orthopedic, cardiac, and neurosurgeons to prevent the ribcage from collapsing into heart and lungs, but my son Jimmy needs international transparency of the heinous crimes, the online character assassination of our family must be stopped, as this could allow surgeons be afforded life-saving access to my son in order to administer advanced treatment without risk to their careers, or being slandered online. Time is of the essence, and each day brings our son closer and closer to death.

We implore your assistance in saving our son.
